## REVIEW ANNUAL ENPLANEMENTS

SCOTT

DISCUSSION

Scott reviewed the enplanements for the United service thus far. Boardings are up significantly.

The third quarter had the highest enplanements for that quarter since 2010. July was especially good with the best July since 2007. Year-to-date is the best since 2011.

The significant improvement is being driven by historically competitive ticket prices. These numbers would be even higher if the reliability of the service could be improved. Scott handed out two charts showing the monthly cancellation rate and on time performance. Scott noted that for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter PQI continued to perform equally as well and in some cases better than Bangor and Portland on these two key benchmarks. The only exception was in the cancellation rate for September. However this would have also been in line with Bangor and Portland if the FAA had not shut down the AWOS to upgrade to a freezing rain sensor.

REVIEW UPCOMING ESSENTIAL AIR SERVICE PROCESS

DISCUSSION Scott reviewed the process for the upcoming EAS bid period. He indicated that process is dictated by the USDOT. USDOT issues the request for bids, receives the bids from interested airlines, and posts the bids for public viewing on the www.regulations.gov site. They then give the community about one month to comment. The public can issue comments directly to USDOT. USDOT also solicits comments from the local elected representatives which in our case is the Presque Isle City Council. Once the comment period is closed, USDOT reviews all the submitted bids and does the selection using the criteria outlined in the request for bids. Scott noted that USDOT does not have to and in numerous of cases does not follow the Community recommendation. Scott handed out examples of cases where USDOT did not follow the Community Recommendation. Once USDOT makes the selection, they enter into a contract with the selected airline. Neither the City of Presque Isle nor the Presque Isle International Airport is party to the contract. All payments go directly from USDOT to the selected Airline. The City of Presque Isle and the Airport do have control of the process by which the elected officials make their final recommendation. In the past the process has started with the airport advisory board reviewing all submitted proposals and making a recommendation to City Council. The Airport Manager presents the board's recommendation to City Council. City Council is free to accept the Airport Board's recommendation or make it's own. Whatever they decided is the recommendation that is submitted to USDOT in the form of a signed letter from the City Manager. For this bid period, there will be one modification in the process. As soon as the bids are made available to the public by USDOT, a public meeting will be held to summarize the bids and take any public comments. This will be done before the Airport Advisory Board deliberates or the City Council votes on its final recommendation. Scott also indicated that prior to the bid process, he is actively involved in trying to get as many airlines
